



Described by Shirley Lanigan, in 'The Open Gardens of Ireland', as 'a paradise garden' and 'a veritable sea of plants', this is an imaginatively designed naturalistic city garden that combines a vibrant mix of annuals, perennials, grasses, shrubs and trees set within a formal layout.

Benvardin Road, Ballybogy, Ballymoney, BT53 6NN. Hugh Montgomery. From Ballymoney head toward Portrush, in the village of Ballybogey turn R into the Benvardin Rd after 1/2 m (before the River Bush) the Gardens are on your R. Sat 10, Sun 11 Feb (12-4.30). Adm £5. chd free, Light refreshments.

The garden at Benvarden enclosed since the C17, when it was most probably a semi-fortified Bawn, built for the purpose of protecting livestock from roaming thieves. Bought by the Montgomery family in the late C18, it was transformed into a modern, for those days, walled garden with the bawn wall faced with brick, the height raised to the present 16ft and paths and beds laid out. From the pond, paths lead to the banks of the River Bush, well-known as the river which leads to the Bushmills Distillery, the world's oldest whiskey, and here the river is spanned by a splendid bridge, built by Robert James Montgomery, who survived the charge of the Heavy Brigade in the Crimean war. Riverside walk.

A mature three acre garden on an historic site. Front of the Georgian rectory is a large lawn with mature trees, an ancient well and a developing woodland garden with a small fernery. Clayburn has been transformed from an exposed site in the shadow of Slemish Mt. to become a low maintenance prairie style garden. It has winter interest, shrubs, grasses and insect attracting perennials along with traditional hedging and many dry stone walls. Also incorporated are numerous trees providing both windbreaks and habitat for many bird species.

Holly House Garden is an area of six acres created out of farmland over the past 20 yrs. The garden comprises woodlands, herbaceous borders and an iris garden where thousands of spring and summer bulbs have been planted. There is an alpine bed, wildlife ponds and a newly planted shrub and woodland garden. Also, in contrast to the traditional parts there is a modern contemporary garden. Partially wheelchair friendly.

Horatio's Garden Northern Ireland is a beautiful, accessible, restorative garden located at the heart of the Spinal Cord Injuries Unit (SCIU) at Musgrave Park Hospital in Belfast. Designed by nine-time RHS Chelsea Gold Medal winner Andy Sturgeon, the garden supports people adjusting to life-changing spinal injuries from across the entirety of Northern Ireland. Designed for patients, their friends and families, and NHS staff spending time at the Spinal Cord Injuries Unit (SCIU) at Musgrave Park Hospital in Belfast. Horatio's Garden Northern Ireland has featured in Belfast Telegraph, Belfast News Letter, Sunday Life, Ulster Tatler, Gardeners' Corner on BBC Radio Ulster and The Lynette Fay Show on BBC Radio Ulster, amongst others, Full wheelchair access throughout the garden.

A relaxed, environmentally friendly country cottage garden which has been under development for the past 9 years. The garden, which inc herbaceous borders, kitchen garden and cut flower garden is pesticide free with wildlife friendly habitats such as pond, log piles, bird boxes and meadow. 
