

Licensed bar, barbeque, teas and homemade cakes. Listed Tudor House with five acres of landscaped gardens set in unspoiled farmland. Two well established natural ponds with rockeries. Herbaceous borders, shrubs, woodland walk and wildflower meadow with a fantastic selection of daffodils, tulips, Camassias and crown imperials. Later in the year, enjoy the spectacular dahlia beds and late season planting, formal beds and orchard. A plant stall and various trade stands as well as children's face painting. Good access for wheelchair users with lawns and wood chip paths. Slight undulations.

Once a monastic site then home to Henry VIII and his children. One of Repton's finest gardens with influences from the Bridgewater dynasty, comprising colourful formal bedding, a rosary, shrubberies and breathtaking views. Free garden introduction talks available on the day. The main garden features, cafe and toilets are accessible via wheelchair.

2 BARLINGS ROAD B2

Harpenden, AL5 2AN. Liz Machin. 1m S of Harpenden. Take A1081 S from Harpenden, after 1m turn R into Beesonend Ln, bear R into Burywick to T-junc. Turn R and follow signs. Evening opening Sat 29 June (5-8). Adm £5, chd free. Wine. This garden has been developed over many years to provide a haven of privacy and peace in an urban setting. Mature trees, shrubs, climbers and perennials with interesting leaf form give year-round structure/ interest. Island beds invite inspection from several perspectives. The tranquil courtyard garden uses plants from a limited colour palette. A shady corner and formal pond add extra interest.
